PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The project consists of design and construction including full building demolition and abatement of existing facilities, site development/adaptation, new construction, and renovations on multiple sites delivering 5 new facilities. P1512F — MCCSSS LOG OPS SCHOOL

One-story 148,000sf practical application facility that provides entry and intermediate level training for MO5 — Motor Transport in the Marine Corps Combat Service Support School (MCCSSS) at Camp Johnson. The new one-story facility will allow for additional marine training throughout; and provide MCCSSS with a state-of-the-art training facility with properly sized and configured spaces for flexibility in motor transport repair training for a variety of the Marine Corps transport vehicle types.

P1512F - JOINT RECEPTION CENTER

One-story 22,000sf training facility to contain Headquarters and Support (H&S) administrative functions and student in-processing functions for Military Occupancy Specialty (MOS) — Motor Transport in the Marine Corps Combat Service Support School (MCCSSS).

P1512F — RENOVATE M107

Interior renovation of Building M107, a building of just over 112,000sf, to house a variety of administrative and training functions. Scope will include a new multi-purpose auditorium, exterior roof replacement, exterior wall and downspout repair/alternations, exterior wall infill, new exterior doors/windows, exterior metal panel replacement, and other features.

P1338F — II MEF SIMULATION/TRAINING CENTER REPLACEMENT

One-story 53,400sf training facility to contain the II Marine Expeditionary Force (MEF) Battle Simulation Center and II MEF Combined Arms and Staff Trainer (CAST). The facility will be constructed on a greenfield site that will include parking, outdoor training areas, and a new building with open secret storage space, containing multiple configurable simulation training classrooms, configurable First Integrated Rehearsal Environment (FIRE) classrooms, audio/visual, computer and server room equipment spaces, and spaces for personnel and administrative support. Also includes demolition of existing buildings 125, 125A, 127, H13, and removal of existing mobile buildings 125B and 125C.

P1527F — LOGCOM CSP WAREHOUSE REPLACEMENT

One-story 109,200sf warehouse facility to contain the Logistics and Command Consolidated Storage Program (LOGCOM) and JPEO-CBD Joint Enterprise Fielding and Surveillance (JEFS) Program that currently occupy an existing warehouse, Building 1601. The facility will be constructed on a site that currently exists as three city blocks. Buildings 1601, 1602, 1603, 1604, and 1605 will be fully demolished, and three city blocks turned into one city block to make way for the new warehouse plus parking expansion. The new warehouse building will include a main warehouse area with pallet racks, shipping and receiving areas, testing rooms, a training/conference room, and support spaces necessary to conduct day-to-day operations. The existing warehouse building will be occupied during construction on the new warehouse. Building 1601 will be fully demolished after it is vacated.
