A Statewide Approach to Service

The North Carolina Military Business Center (NCMBC) is a statewide business development and technology transition entity of the State of North Carolina, embedded in community colleges and headquartered at Fayetteville Technical Community College. The mission of the NCMBC is to leverage military and other federal business opportunities to expand the economy, grow jobs and improve quality of life in North Carolina.

- NCMBC goals:**
- *Contracts:* to increase federal revenues for North Carolina businesses
 - *Employment:* to support the integration of transitioning military, family members and veterans into the NC workforce
 - *Recruitment:* to support the recruitment of defense businesses to North Carolina
 - *Technology Transition:* to introduce North Carolina technologies to the Department of Defense (DoD)

The DoD has an annual impact of \$79.7 billion and is the second largest sector of North Carolina’s economy (12.8% of state GDP). With six major military bases, over 100 National Guard and Reserve facilities and the fourth highest number of uniformed military personnel in the country, the State of North Carolina created the NCMBC to leverage opportunities with these installations, DoD commands and federal agencies operating worldwide.

The NCMBC connects North Carolina firms to current government contracting opportunities in two ways – with a team of business development specialists across the state who also provide technical services, and electronically with MatchForce.org. Additionally, the NCMBC conducts several strategic initiatives including:

- Market intelligence – identifying future business opportunities in key sectors
- Pre-positioning and training – for future and current opportunities
- Current business development – connecting businesses to contract opportunities
- Solicitation and proposal support – assisting businesses to compete and win
- Training and resources – providing tools to overcome contracting obstacles
- Events and networking – focused on bringing business and government together

The NCMBC connects North Carolina firms to current government contracting opportunities in two ways – with a team of business development specialists across the state who also provide technical services, and electronically with MatchForce.org.

The NCMBC’s Regional Program Managers and Strategic Industry Professional teams include experienced business and federal contracting professionals operating from 13 community colleges across the state.

These professionals identify the most lucrative federal contract opportunities (prime and subcontracts), notify and pre-position firms for specific opportunities, and assist firms with federal solicitations, proposals and successful execution of federal contracts.

Additionally, MatchForce.org automatically matches over 24,000 NC businesses to tens of thousands of federal contract opportunities every day.

In 2025, NCMBC professionals focused on contract opportunities in targeted industry sectors - each with growing DoD demand and with significant business capacity in North Carolina - with a special emphasis on: construction & infrastructure; medical, biomedical & biodefense; cybersecurity; energy & environmental; agriculture, food & beverage; textiles & soldier systems; and combat systems (aerospace, ground vehicles, armaments and maritime).

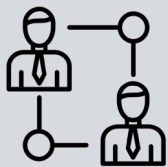

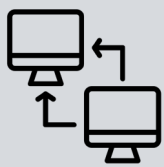

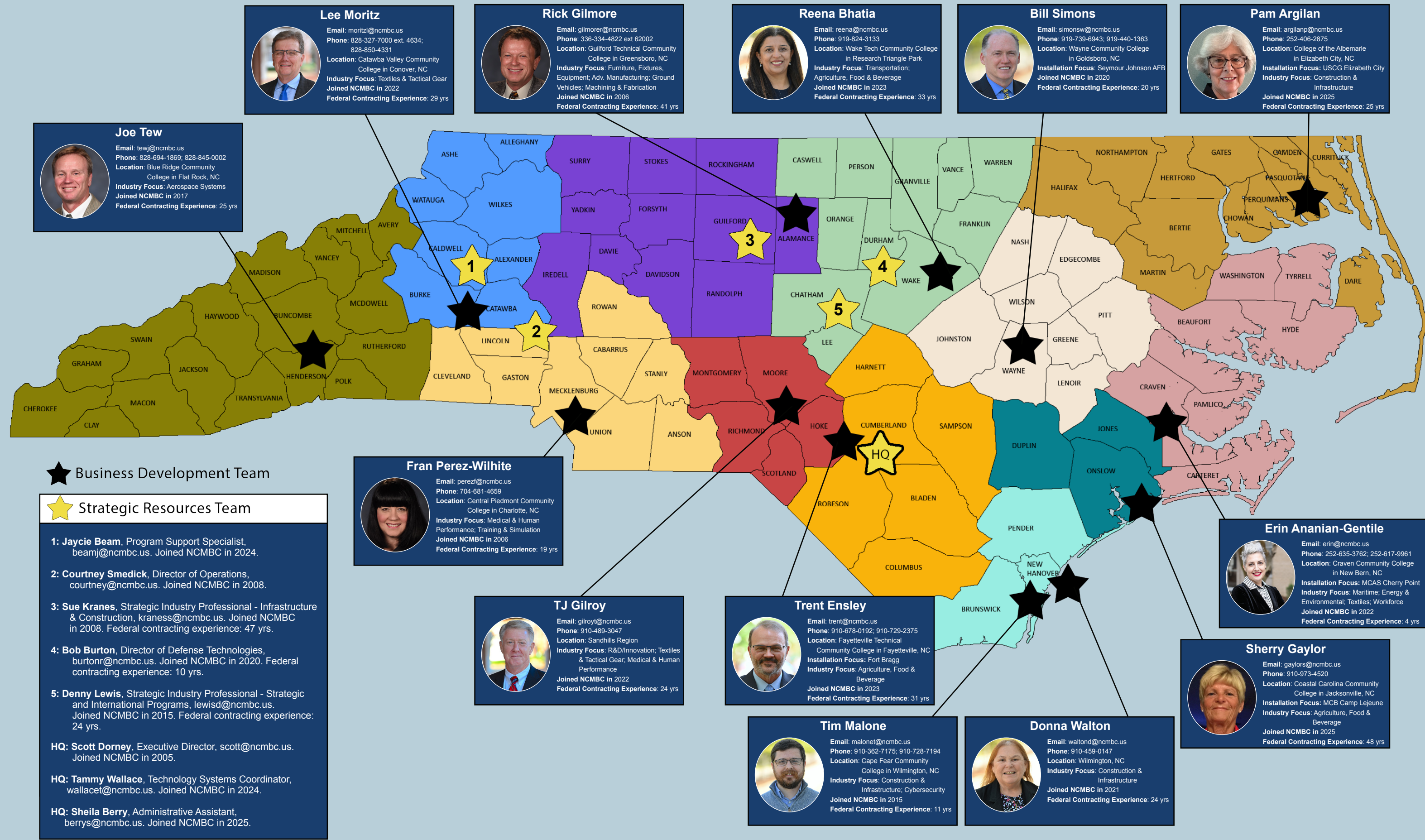

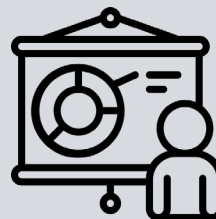

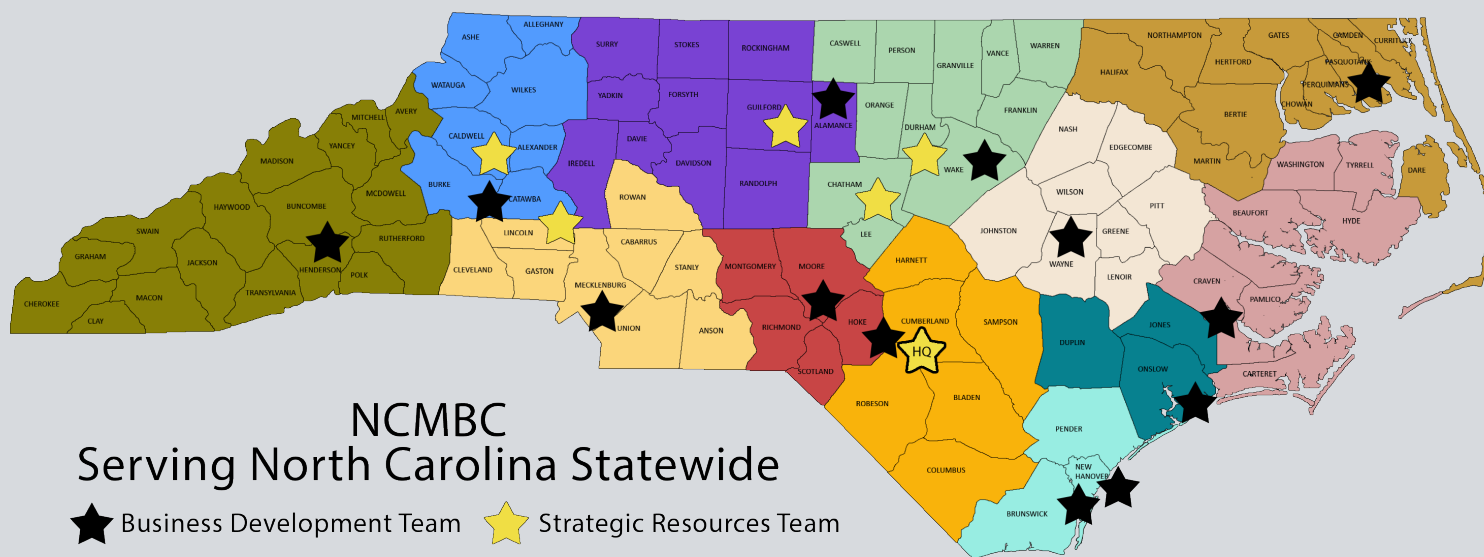
