Anchor institutions: place-based, mission-driven entities with significant purchasing power and resources that are committed to leveraging these resources to improve the long-term wellbeing of their communities.

Examples: Local, state, and tribal governments; universities; hospitals; military bases; and other large employers.

NCGrowth's Anchor Institution work helps these institutions drive transformational, sustainable economic development by radically increasing purchasing from small, local businesses that represent the demographics of the local community.



Small Business Centers at our 58 community colleges **Small Business Technology Development Centers** (SBTDCs) at each UNC school


